Ohio-Israel Agricultural Initiative Presents Israeli Horticultural Firms at OFA 2011 Short Course Tradeshow

Cleveland, OH, June 28, 2011 – The Ohio-Israel Agricultural Initiative of The Negev Foundation (www.negev.org) is sponsoring a booth at the OFA 2011 Short Course Tradeshow <u>at the Greater</u> Columbus Convention Center <u>in Columbus, Ohio</u>, July 10-12, 2011. <u>The Ohio-Israel Agricultural</u> Initiative (Booth #1855) <u>will showcase Israel's latest in horticultural innovations, technology and equipment.</u>

Israeli firms represented will include: Agam Greenhouse Energy Systems Ltd., a company offering dehumidification systems for greenhouses (www.agam-greenhouses.com); CY (Chen-Yaffe) Seeds, which provides ornamental asparagus seeds (www.cyseeds.com); Diversified Imports, which supplies equipment to the greenhouse industry (www.diversifiedimports.com); and Pelemix, which provides coco coir based substrates for greenhouses, nurseries, potting soil, and gardening (www.pelemix.com). Representatives of all the Israeli companies and the Ohio-Israel Agricultural Initiative will be on hand at the Ohio-Israel booth to promote the Israeli products.

"All of the products we present were designed in Israel, renowned for its advanced agricultural technologies," said Dr. Sarah Horowitz, the Ohio-Israel Agricultural Initiative's Program Director. "Visitors to the Ohio-Israel Agricultural Initiative_booth can learn how we can help Ohio and Israeli companies while enhancing trade opportunities in both regions."

The Ohio-Israel Agricultural Initiative of The Negev Foundation is dedicated to improving agricultural trade and R&D ties between Ohio and Israel by working with growers and government, academic, and business entities in both regions.
